May 20 marks the 20th anniversary of the first photo sent from Space by the NASA/European Space Agency Hubble Space Telescope. The telescope is named for renowned American Astronomer Edwin Hubble, whose discovery in the 1920s that countless galaxies exist beyond our own Milky Way revolutionized our understanding of the universe and our place within it. Over the last two decades, the Hubble Space Telescope has transformed our understanding of the universe, taking spectacular photos such as the one above of M81, an especially bright spiral galaxy.
