The Lewis Center for Educational Research celebrates the July 24th birthday of a woman who captured the imagination of the entire world and has held it for more than 80 years—the legendary Amelia Earhart. Amelia was a true pioneer, an adventurer who flew higher and farther than any woman in the world. She made history in 1928 as she became the first woman to fly across the Atlantic and accomplished dozens of other aviation firsts. Her disappearance on July 2, 1937 is still one of history’s most fascinating mysteries. On the most challenging leg of an around-the-world-flight, she took off from New Guinea enroute to tiny Howland Island in the mid-Pacific. She never arrived, and no trace of her has ever been found. Theories about her disappearance abound today. Yet, because of her courage, passion and panache, she remains the most famous woman pilot ever. At The Lewis Center, we admire Amelia’s spirit of excellence. We instill a quest for success in our students by firing their imaginations with revolutionary educational concepts. These innovative methods are working. This June, all 96 of our seniors graduated. Ninety-one are going to college (earning \$1.27 million in scholarships) and five are entering military service.
