APPLE VALLEY — There are a number of volunteers at the Academy of Academic Excellence who contribute just as much dedication and time as the paid staff, according to Principal Gordon Soholt.

Patty Pinkstaff is one of these exemplary volunteers, Soholt said.

"She is one of those people who just is everything at the school," Soholt said. "You can call on her to do anything at any time, and she does it."

Pinkstaf f received the "Charter School Volunteer of the Year" award from the California Charter Schools Association in Sacramento Friday.

Pinkstaff has a junior and a senior at the academy, and she has been an active volunteer for seven years. She considers volunteering for the academy her full-time job.

The volunteer award is one of about 50 Hart Vision awards presented to California charter schools each year. One charter school volunteer receives this award annually based on nominations from their school.
